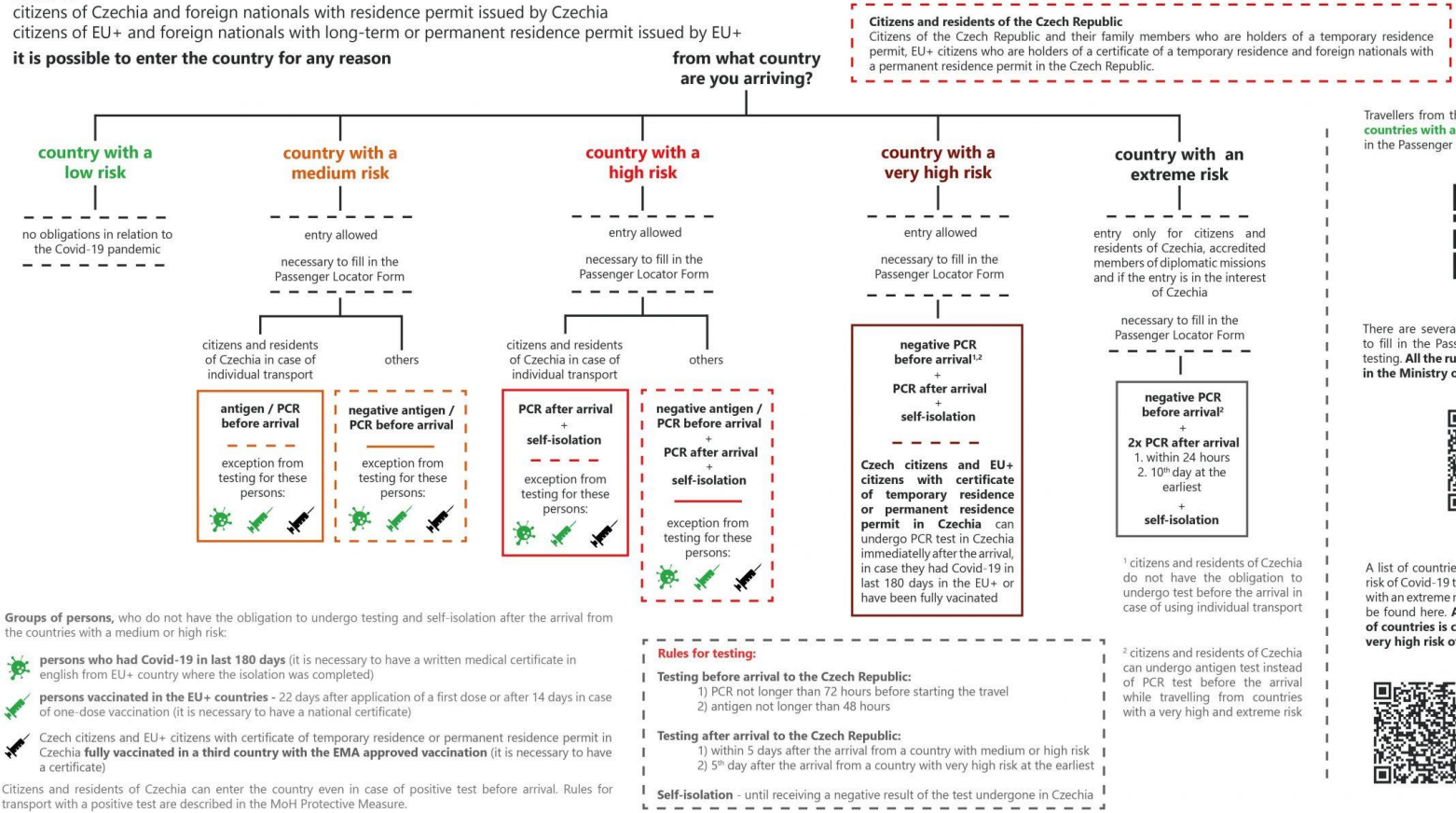


Rules for entry and return to the Czech Republic (as of 21st June 2021)

PART A

citizens of Czechia and foreign nationals with residence permit issued by Czechia
 citizens of EU+ and foreign nationals with long-term or permanent residence permit issued by EU+
it is possible to enter the country for any reason



Travellers from the countries that **are not** part of **countries with a low risk** have an obligation to fill in the Passenger Locator Form before the arrival.



There are several exceptions from the obligation to fill in the Passenger Locator Form or undergo testing. **All the rules and exceptions can be found in the Ministry of Health Protective Measure.**



A list of countries with a low, medium and high risk of Covid-19 transmission and list of countries with an extreme risk of Covid-19 transmission can be found here. **A country listed in neither list of countries is considered as a country with a very high risk of Covid-19 transmission.**



Groups of persons, who do not have the obligation to undergo testing and self-isolation after the arrival from the countries with a medium or high risk:

-  **persons who had Covid-19 in last 180 days** (it is necessary to have a written medical certificate in english from EU+ country where the isolation was completed)
-  **persons vaccinated in the EU+ countries** - 22 days after application of a first dose or after 14 days in case of one-dose vaccination (it is necessary to have a national certificate)
-  Czech citizens and EU+ citizens with certificate of temporary residence or permanent residence permit in Czechia **fully vaccinated in a third country with the EMA approved vaccination** (it is necessary to have a certificate)

Citizens and residents of Czechia can enter the country even in case of positive test before arrival. Rules for transport with a positive test are described in the MoH Protective Measure.

Rules for testing:

Testing before arrival to the Czech Republic:

- 1) PCR not longer than 72 hours before starting the travel
- 2) antigen not longer than 48 hours

Testing after arrival to the Czech Republic:

- 1) within 5 days after the arrival from a country with medium or high risk
- 2) 5th day after the arrival from a country with very high risk at the earliest

Self-isolation - until receiving a negative result of the test undergone in Czechia

¹ citizens and residents of Czechia do not have the obligation to undergo test before the arrival in case of using individual transport

² citizens and residents of Czechia can undergo antigen test instead of PCR test before the arrival while travelling from countries with a very high and extreme risk
